

Legal Notice to City of San Diego Wastewater Customers

On June 7, 2024, Superior Court of California, County of San Diego certified a class action lawsuit alleging that the City of San Diego (“Defendant”) used wastewater rate revenues to subsidize the Industrial Wastewater Control Program (“IWCP”). The class action seeks monetary and injunctive relief on behalf of Plaintiffs and all other customers who paid wastewater rates to Defendant. No trial has occurred yet on Plaintiffs’ allegations.

The Court has allowed the lawsuit to proceed as a class action on behalf of all San Diego Public Utility Department (“SDPUD”) customers who paid bills for wastewater services provided to a residential or commercial/industrial account at an address within the City of San Diego and not subject to IWCP permitting, on or after July 1, 2014 and until June 7, 2024, excluding Defendant and Defendant’s officers, directors, employees, agents, and affiliates, and the Court and its staff.

If you exclude yourself from the class, you will not receive the benefit of a judgment or settlement of the case but will preserve your right to sue the Defendant at your own expense.
